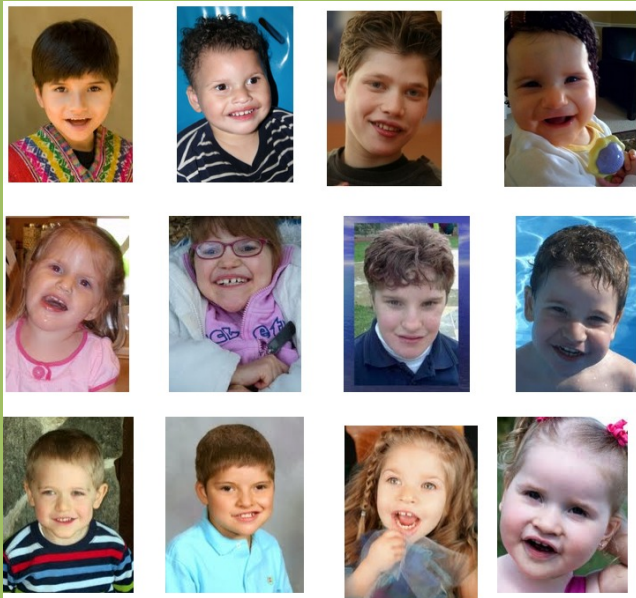

Pitt Hopkins Syndrome (**PTHS**) is a rare genetic disorder affecting a specific gene in chromosome 18, called TCF4. TCF4 plays an essential role in the development of the nervous system and the brain and any functional deficiency of TCF4 greatly affects how a child develops over time.
