

RISING RESEARCHERS



NSF BACKS LOCAL RESEARCH

A team of researchers at Wake Forest University, the University of Kentucky, and Princeton University have received a National Science Foundation Special Creativity extension for their work developing organic semiconductors. Physics professor Dr. Oana Jurchescu leads the Wake Forest effort, and is the first Wake Forest faculty member to receive this award. The team is developing cutting-edge methods to get flexible electronics technology on the market more quickly, to be used in healthcare applications.

ADVANCING BIOMANUFACTURING



A multi-organizational team that includes Forsyth Tech is one of sixteen member teams in the nation to receive funding to accelerate bioindustrial manufacturing in the United States from BioMADE: the Bioindustrial Manufacturing and Design Ecosystem. Forsyth Tech's member team will focus on nanobiotechnology to inspire the next generation of the skilled biomanufacturing workforce. The program will inspire students to learn about leveraging microbes in bioindustrial manufacturing. They will use cutting-edge technologies like hand-held DNA sequencers and scanning electron microscopes in classrooms.




